BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Buildings and Grounds is entering the 2017 season with enthusiasm and a sense

of anticipation. 2016-2017 saw the design and completion of a beautiful and functional patio area between the Clubhouse lanai and the pool. It is rewarding to see that it has already been used by so many of our residents, especially during Tiki Fridays. The planter area in front of the Clubhouse was removed and that area, the front entry sidewalk, the mail room floor, and the bicycle area were recoated and sealed. The new finish is attractive and enhances the entryway to the Clubhouse. Several additional projects have been completed or are scheduled. Posts have been installed on the island at the gate entrance to TW to help prevent the destruction of plants and curbing by drivers turning to exit before getting to the front gates. Unhealthy trees along TW Blvd. were removed and replaced, and landscaping at the front entrance has been upgraded and maintained. Refinishing the Great Hall and stage floor has been approved by the Board of Directors and will be completed this summer. Also, the Bocce court has been approved to be resurfaced. The TW Board of Directors has also directed the Buildings and Grounds Committee to provide information on the process, design, and cost of erecting a storage building in the RV lot which would replace the existing units which are deteriorating and in need of major repair or replacement. A subcommittee of Buildings and Grounds has been formed to move forward with this project. We will keep you updated as we proceed.

The One Call Now system can deliver messages by phone, SMS text and/or email. Each resident can have up to six phone numbers and five email addresses assigned to them. This will allow for messages to be sent to home phones, work phone, cell phones, etc.

We now are able to better communicate with residents while reducing the need to print and distribute notices. We will be able to send urgent messages such as weather, evacuations, watch advisories, or Amber alerts.

Your personal information will not be shared with anyone. This information is never sold or shared and you will not receive unsolicited calls because of it. 

There are many topics that we have reported on over the years, but our various and sundry bulletin boards have not been one of them. There are places to post information about almost any subject that might be of interest to our residents. These bulletin boards are located both inside and outside of the community building and each one has guidelines that should be followed. The ones on either side of the entrance are reserved for posters announcing the upcoming social activities scheduled by TWERC. These include any activity where tickets might be on sale such as dances, performances, special planned events, especially those that might involve the use of the entire clubhouse or large groups. The two small boards in the mailroom area are to be used by residents for the purpose of listing items and services. The size of the postings for sale is limited to 3 X 5 cards and should be dated because 30 days is the time allotted. Additionally, vendors who advertise in the Topics may place business cards here. No outside postings are allowed and will be removed if placed on any bulletin board. Sign-up sheets for Saturday coffee and volunteers for lockup duties, homes for sale or rental and special announcements have space allotted as well. Sign-up lists for many sports and games also have a large area in the card room. The two boards immediately to the left of the entry to the mailroom are for the use of the office, Board of Directors, and the TWERC Board. The three boards left of these are for additional TWERC activities. The Tennis Group has boards outside the tennis courts which are used for information about their activities such as schedules. In fact, I volunteered to chair this one person committee awhile back, so if you need a poster or have a question, you can call me at 223-5159.




