
- 1) Olive oil, green tea and leafy greens (broccoli, spinach and kale)-antioxidant superfoods that help fight inflammation.

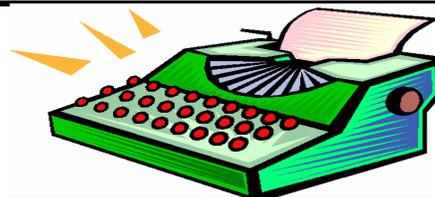




